SUMMARY

The Highway Maintenance Worker performs all assigned duties necessary for the maintenance of Christian County highways, bridges and facilities.

REPORTING RELATIONSHIPS

Responsible to the Maintenance Supervisor for successful performance of assigned duties.

ESSENTIAL DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES: (May not include all duties performed)

- Operates a variety of equipment, vehicles and vehicles with attachments to include: trucks, tractors, mowers, end loaders, graders, backhoes, fork lift, excavators, oil distributors and rollers.
- Must be able to use hand tools including but not limited to rake, shovel, sledge hammer, hammer, drill, grinder, cut-off saw, pavement saw, vibratory compactor, chain saw, screw driver, wrenches, floor jack, trailer jack, pressure washer, level and laser level.
- Performs roadway surface and shoulder repairs. Examples: Excavating, grading and leveling, adding aggregate, pot hole patching, spreading cold mix, oil and chip, saw cutting and paint striping.
- Clean and grade ditches to drain.
- Repair or replace drainage structures under roadways, field entrances and private entrances.
- Mows grass and weeds on right-of-way; remove trees, limbs and brush as needed; spray for the elimination of roadside vegetation and brush; periodically clean right-of-way by hand.
- Snow plowing and applying winter aggregates in inclimate weather.
- Repair and maintenance of bridges and waterways.
- Assists in maintenance of highway equipment, making minor adjustments and repairs; reports equipment breakdowns and malfunctions to the Maintenance Supervisor.
- Repair and maintenance of County owned facilities.
- May serve as lead worker to an on-site maintenance crew, supervising completion of a maintenance assignment and making minor decisions in the absence of the Maintenance Supervisor.
- Performs assigned duties as required.

METHODS OF ACCOUNTABILITY

- Through accurate, professional and error-free completion of assigned work.
- Compliance with County Policies, procedures and expectations.

STANDARDS OF PERFORMANCE

- Individual Proficiencies:
 - Ability to follow directions.
 - o Ability to perform duties with minimal direct supervision.
 - o Ability to work well with others.
- Job Performance:
 - o Timeliness, adequacy and accuracy of duties.
 - o Flexibility in performing assigned duties.
 - Use of established procedures in varied conditions, uses initiative to overcome minor obstacles.
 - o Normal or reasonable care used to prevent loss.
 - o Ability to organize and prioritize work.

PHYSICAL ATTRIBUTES/DEMANDS

The physical demands described here are representative of those that must be met by an employee to successfully perform the essential functions of this job.

- While performing the duties of this job, the employee is frequently required to work in a standing or seated position for extended periods of time. The employee is also frequently required to walk, climb stairs/ramps/ladders, navigate rough terrain, get in and out of vehicles and equipment, bend, kneel, squat, reach, carry, push, pull and grip objects intermittently during the course of work.
- The employee shall exert up to 75 pounds of force occasionally, up to 50 pounds of force frequently and a negligible amount of force constantly to move objects.
- Work requires hearing and speaking ability to carry on a conversation with individuals in person, over the telephone and radio.
- Ability to maintain a high level of visual attention. Specific vision abilities required include close vision, distance vision, color vision, peripheral vision and the ability to adjust focus.

WORK ENVIRONMENT AND CONDITIONS

- Performs work outdoors during extreme weather conditions and in adverse conditions.
- Performs work indoors in controlled climate.
- While performing the duties of this job, staff may be exposed to chemicals, fumes and extreme hot or cold temperatures.
- Highway maintenance activities may expose staff to hazardous conditions i.e. equipment, noise, gasoline, chemicals, etc.
- May perform work in high places.
- Some duties performed in a well-ventilated, well-lighted and temperature-controlled shop environment. Noise levels may be high.
- The position is subject to drug testing pre-employment, random, post-accident or injury or reasonable suspicion.
- Work hours are generally Monday Friday, 7:00 am 3:30 pm.
- May work irregular and extended hours.
- Position is on-call 24 hours during periods of inclimate weather.

KNOWLEDGE, SKILLS AND ABILITIES

- Ability to operate, or learn the operation of standard vehicular equipment utilized in Highway maintenance and repair.
- Ability to utilize hand tools used in highway maintenance and repair.
- Ability to perform manual labor.
- Ability to multitask and perform assigned duties in a frequently disruptive environment.
- Ability to understand and follow oral and written instructions.
- Ability to communicate effectively both orally and in writing.
- Ability to add, subtract, multiply and divide using whole numbers, common fractions and decimals.
- Ability to establish and maintain effective working relationships with other employees, Township Highway Commissioners and the public.

EDUCATION, TRAINING AND EXPERIENCE

- High school diploma or general education degree (GED).
- Possess and maintain an Illinois Class A CDL Driver's License with air brake endorsement and no manual transmission restriction.
- Requires licensing, or the ability to obtain licensing, for the application of pesticides on public right-of-way as issued by the State of Illinois Department of Agriculture.
- Training in the job as required. This includes but is not limited to Flagger Certification, Work Zone Safety, CPR and OHSHA 10 hr. Safety Training.
- One year experience in highway maintenance or a related field, preferred but not required.
- Working knowledge of the procedures, methods, and materials utilized in highway maintenance and repair, preferred but not required.
